

While November is the month of Thanksgiving, the month that kicks off the Christmas season among other things, for Immanuel, November is a month that often focuses on leadership. Normally the third Wednesday of November every year is our biannual voters meeting where we elect church leaders. As a quick refresher, most elected positions at Immanuel are for 2 years. This includes board chairs and officers (treasurer, secretary, financial secretary). The exceptions are the Elders who serve a three year term and the Chair Elect which is the first of the 3 positions that succeed one another, (chair elect, chairperson and past chair). The election each year sees approximately half of the council up for election leaving the remaining half for the next year. Leaders can each run for a second term in each position before hitting their term limits. This well designed system allows for a mix of returning leaders but also requires an inflow of new people (or at least new to a particular position) over the years.

I've been proud of our leaders over many years, but I'm especially proud of the current group as they have grappled with not only the routine tasks of their positions but also the larger big picture issues facing Immanuel. Covid and its aftermath, significant changes in our community and the over all decline in participation in Church life in our society have presented challenges that are all together new to our congregation. This particular group has spent the year discussing these challenges and asking the tough questions as to how we can be the most effective congregational Body of Christ possible in the face of difficult times. We have been looking at the book "Autopsy of a Dying Church" by Thom Rainer to help guide our discussion and I believe it has been very helpful. We are just now getting to the "what do we do now" part of the discussion. While we must, and will continue to do the essential things of the Church such as preaching and teaching the Word of God, properly administering the sacraments, caring for those in need and reaching out with the Gospel in an inviting way, we also will look at new and different ways to carry out those tasks.

As we prepare for the election of new leaders at the voters meeting this month, I am excited about those whom God has called to





In the first service, come and join us on a tour of the streets of Jerusalem. In Jerusalem we step into the world of Zechariah-a world where God is far off, where repentance is necessary, and where the blood of sacrifice serves as the only point of connection between God's people and their God. Our time in Jerusalem reminds us that Jesus is born into this world as a baby to one day sacrifice himself for us that we might be united with God forever.

#### 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, December 13th Nazareth

In the second service, we step into Nazareth, the small hometown of Mary and Joseph-a town in which, through Gabriel's visit, God begins to make his home with us. Our time in this place reminds us that Jesus makes his home with us in our hearts this Christmas and dwells with us always.

#### 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, December 20th Bethlehem

In the third service, we travel with Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem to the place where the imminence of God's presence, the hopefulness of God's coming, and the faithfulness of God's promises are so wonderfully clear. Our time in this place reminds us that Jesus is the fulfillment of our faith and the beginning of new life for us.

Do you have a favorite hymn? Can you sing it from memory? Hymns are poetic prayers set

to music. They have been written over the years by gifted people. Some were written by theologians such as Martin Luther who wrote Dear Christians One and All Rejoice LSB 556.Lord Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word LSB 655, A Mighty Fortress LSB 656, From Heaven Above to Earth I Come LSB 358, and Christ Lav in Deaths Strong Bands LSB 458.

These as well as other hymns have strong content and make meaningful prayers because they have a scriptural basis. There are hymns for every Liturgical season such as Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, Baptism, The Lord's Supper, The Church Militant, The Church Triumphant, Praise and Adoration, Hope and Comfort, Mission and Witness ,Vocation, Morning ,Evening, and New Year. A good practice is to arrive a few minutes before the worship service and use the time to look at the hymns listed for the day. You'll gain more meaning when singing the hymns during the service. In our Journey into Prayer, we learned that those who want to grow in prayer would do well to pray the hymns and memorize them too. Singing hymns from memory with a person who has dementia or someone who is dying can be very rewarding. It's a familiar way to connect them with God.

A Bible, Luther's Catechism, and a hymnal are good to have in every home for study and prayer.
