

Some of you may remember Rev. Kris Whitby who was a guest preacher at Immanuel for one of our Wednesday evening Lenten services this past March. Pastor Whitby recently published a book entitled *Come and be Filled—Feasting*



Week after week, students gather at this welcoming space, which quickly becomes their "home." Here, they form friendships not only with other international students but also with Americans who help serve the meals and soon become like family. The group, Network of Nations, organizes these weekly meals and also keeps students informed about campus and community events, such as trips to Starved Rock and other local attractions. Prior to the meal a conversation hour is ordinarily available in the student lounge at Immanuel for those who wish to use or practice their English.

Network of Nations has an Executive Director (Lisa Dietrich) and a governing board of Christian community members. They have an office and some space at 449 Normal Road.

Fundraiser dinners have supplied a large portion of operating costs for the Network. **This year fundraiser dinners are scheduled for August 7 and 8 at 449 Normal Road**. Each night is to be a complimentary meal with a program telling of current activity and plans for the days ahead. Let Linda Sons know of your interest in attending any of these dinners.
