

In September we began offering many of our Christian education programs which had been on break for the summer. One of these programs is confirmation instruction for our youth. The class we currently have is an unusual one. The 9 students are in 7th, 8th and 9th grade, and this will confirm their faith in May. This group started this journey

in the fall of 2024, and as they begin their second year together it is exciting to see them grow in knowledge, faith and their relationship with each other and the Church.

This got me thinking that you all might find interesting how we structure confirmation, the reasons behind that, and most importantly, what the real purpose of confirmation is. We'll start with the purpose that guides the process. Confirmation is a process that equips young adults to "confirm their faith." By doing so they affirm the gifts God gave to them in their baptism to recognize and desire to be part of God's family through His Church and, more specifically, Immanuel congregation.

It is important to note that the congregation does not "confirm" them, they confirm what God has done for them and that Immanuel is the family through which they want live out their Christian life. This is very different from the old school notion that confirmation (and the certificate) grant you a "license to Lutheran." Confirmation is not a graduation (although we do make it look kind of like that with robes, etc.) and is instead a commitment to God's family though our congregation. In order to truly confirm what God has done for them, the students need to be educated in God's Word and the application of that Word, for which Luther's Small Catechism is an excellent resource.

Over the years I've shaped and honed this education process and have developed what we use now, which I find most effective in accomplishing not only the goal of education, but also relationship development. While instruction takes place in various ways, including Sunday morning during worship and in the home with parents, the Wednesday evening instruction is structured like this:

Classroom instruction: In person class meetings are Wednesday evening from 5:30pm - 6:30pm in fellowship hall. (5:30 – 7:00 the fourth Wednesday of each month)

Typical monthly schedule follows this model:

- the first Wednesday of the month will be a class session with parents;
- the second Wednesday of the month will be just students;



The Gift of Prayer

We live in a "Do it Yourself Society". If you go into a Christian book shop you will find many self -help books that teach us how to pray. People are looking for the right method of prayer.

In Luke 11 the disciples asked Jesus "Lord teach us to pray". Jesus taught them that God'pleasing prayer depended on Him rather than the person at prayer. He gave them His

own prayer: the Lord's Prayer. He invited them to join Him in His prayer to God the Father.

We pray this prayer in every worship service, at church meetings, and our daily devotions. Sometimes it becomes rote for us and we fail to see the meaning of it.

To understand it better, remember that Jesus invites us to join Him in praying to God the Father. He includes us in His relationship with the Father when we say "Our Father who art in Heaven"

He identifies Himself with us as True Man in the last three petitions when He asks for daily bread, forgiveness of sins, and protection from temptation. He sides with us and speaks up for us.

Also, Jesus recognizes our human weakness and inability to pray as God requires so we are given the Holy Spirit.
